# Results

### Overall Positive Results

- STRs are declining and licensure is rising as hosts come into compliance
- STRs have declined every week since the first letter was mailed to unlicensed hosts in November 2017
- Licensure increased from 11% in August 2017 to 35% in January 2018, two months after mailing the first letter to unlicensed hosts




### **PHMDC Host Compliance Implementation**



City of Madison STR hosts are steadily coming into compliance by either becoming licensed or by deleting their STR listings.

### **PHMDC Total Licenses by Year**



We can't predict total licenses for 2018, but there were 16 new licenses by the end of January, for a total of 101 licenses in the first month of 2018.

### **Background**

- STRs were steadily increasing, but licensure wasn't keeping up
- Complete information for hosts was not available in one easy to find location
- The Host Compliance contract was signed in August 2017 to identify short-term rental hosts



### **PHMDC Host Compliance Implementation**

Goals:

- Create smooth integration between hosts and city agencies
- Provide residents with accurate information about requirements
- Meet demand of increased license questions, applications, and inspections

### Working with Host Compliance Company:

- Highly responsive to PHMDC; excellent customer service
- May implement new data analysis tools suggested by PHMDC
- Important to have PHMDC staff to manage Host Compliance
- 71% identification rate
- Low error rate
